Glove Theatre Museum



The Glove Theatre Museum, 42 N. Main St., hosts a timeline of The Glove Theatre and Gloversville's past, as well as movie posters, pictures of stars and an old-style film projector from the 1920s. The theatre began in the early 1900s and was once owned by the Schine Brothers who brought in vaudeville acts from around the country. Acts included Jack Benney, Buddy Ebsen and Ann Rutherford. NYS Baseball Hall of Fame



The New York State Baseball Hall of Fame was founded in 2010 and officially opened its physical museum facility in July 2023 directly across from historic Parkhurst Field at 45 Harrison St. The museum honors players, coaches, broadcasters, and key contributors across all levels of New York State baseball history, featuring a plaque wall, over 60 player lockers, unique artifacts, and a 60-seat theater showcasing classic baseball films.
